## **VETERANS COMMUNITY PROJECT BREAKING GROUND ON TINY HOUSE VILLAGE FOR HOMELESS VETERANS IN LONGMONT**

### **VCP Village to provide housing and support services for Veterans in need**

**WHAT** A private, outdoor groundbreaking ceremony will mark the start of construction of VCP Village – Longmont, the first expansion site of Kansas City-based Veterans Community Project. The groundbreaking ceremony will feature remarks by Governor Jared Polis, as well as Bryan Meyer and Mark Solomon, co-founders of Veterans Community Project.

VCP Village - Longmont is a crossover venture between Veterans Community Project, The City of Longmont, and HMS Development. Located on a 2-acre property approximately 13 miles northeast of Boulder, the Village will consist of 26 tiny houses, ranging from 240 – 320 square feet, and a 3,000 square foot community center. The community center will serve as “base camp,” providing case management services, education, health and wellness programming, and social activities for the Veterans who live in the Village.

VCP Village – Longmont is modeled after Kansas City’s innovative transitional housing model which has already successfully transitioned more than 40 formerly homeless Veterans into permanent housing.
